Qur'an	The holy book of Islam, containing God's words as revealed to the Prophet Muhammad.		
Mosque	A Muslim place of worship where people pray, learn, and gather as a community.		
Prophet Muhammad	The last prophet in Islam, who received God's message in the Qur'an.
