## Why do Christians believe that Easter is a celebration of victory?

Victory	Winning or succeeding, especially after a struggle or battle.		<p>Christians believe that Christ's resurrection is a victory over death and talk about it with understanding.</p> <p>Christians believe that the death and resurrection of Jesus restored the relationship between God and people.</p> <p>The Easter story is at the very heart of Christian belief.</p>
Triumph	A great victory or achievement, often celebrated.		
Resurrection	When Jesus came back to life after His death.		
Sacrifice	Giving up something valuable for the good of others, like Jesus giving His life.		
Salvation	Being saved from sin and its consequences, through Jesus.		
Redeemer	A title for Jesus, meaning the one who saves people from sin.

How does his victory affect the lives of Christians today? How do the events and services that take place in churches during Holy Week and Easter reflect Christian belief that Jesus' death and resurrection was a victory?
