Subject specific Vocabulary		Images/Diagrams/Maps	Important Knowledge
Betrayal	When someone breaks trust or hurts a friend by being dishonest or doing something wrong.		Trust and forgiveness are key values across World Faiths.
Forgiveness	Choosing to stop being angry with someone who has hurt or wronged you, and letting go of the hurt.		Being forgiven by God and forgiving others is a key teaching in sacred scriptures across World Faiths.
Gethsemane	A garden where Jesus prayed before His arrest, asking for God's help.		The incidents of betrayal and trust in the Easter story are significant to the outcome.
Jerusalem	An important city in Christianity, where Jesus was crucified and rose from the dead.		The events of Holy Week and Easter are key to understanding what Jesus came to earth to do – God's salvation plan.
Judas	One of Jesus' disciples who betrayed Him by telling His enemies where He was.		Christians believe that they can trust Jesus.
Loyalty	Being faithful and sticking by someone, even when it's hard.		Key Questions What is trust? How do we show trust? Who do we trust? Why? Why is trust important? Why did Judas betray Jesus? What does it mean to betray someone? How does it feel to be betrayed? What is forgiveness? Have you ever forgiven someone?
Peter	One of Jesus' disciples, known for his strong faith, but he later denied knowing Jesus three times.		
Trust	Believing that someone will do what is right and keep their promises.

Write a letter from Mary Magdalene to a friend (Peter or John) describing the resurrection and how she might be feeling.
